
# Mission Accomplished – From the Rooftop to the Pews and Altar



We have done a lot of things in our alma mater since we became organized as the CCC Old Girls Association, USA/Canada (tax-exempt incorporated in the State of Arizona). We have provided funds for dining hall benches, donated a generator, computers and accessories, double-bunk beds, and scholarships to students. Each of these projects is a thing of pride for us and gratitude to our financial supporters. However, the completion of the chapel project is a source of immense pride. It is our magnum opus.

Through the sacrifices of our "girls" and the generous donations from our supporters in the USA and Canada, we raised money for the roofing of the chapel, construction of the beautiful altar and pulpit (lectern), the pews. The chapel project cost nearly \$9,000, a satisfying sacrifice that has ensured that the CCC chapel is once again a safe place of spiritual and emotional fulfillment for current Cornelians.

## **Serving our Communities**

As part of our commitment to serve society and improve the human condition, we make annual donations to schools in our communities. This year, we have donated school supplies worth more than \$600 to schools in Michigan and Texas. Also, in response to the need created by the COVID-19 pandemic and the subsequent shutdowns, we made cash donations of \$1,020.93 to four food banks in Georgia, Texas, Tennessee and Florida.

### Scholarship Awards ... and a Luncheon!

At the end of the 2019/2020 academic year, we presented cash donations of N30,000 and Certificates of Excellence to the best students in SSS3 and SSS2 in each of the following categories: Arts, Commercial and Science.

First-placed students in SSS1, JSS3, JSS2 and JSS1 in each category also received N30,000. Second-placed students received 20,000 while third-placed students received N10,000. Cornelian Aniefiok Udoh (Class of 1979) presented the items on behalf of CCC Old Girls Association, USA/Canada. The principal at the time, Mrs. Grace Ekwere (in a blue dress in the left photos), officiated at the ceremony.

These awards were repeated at the end of the 2020/2021 school year for the best achieving SSS3 students in Arts, Commercial and Science categories. Cornelian Iniobong Affiah (Class of 1979) presented the awards on our behalf. Achieving students in the lower grades (SSS2 to JSS1) will receive their awards and certificates during the award assembly on November 27, 2021.

To ensure that students who did not receive awards were not left out of the celebration, the entire student body (at least those present on campus at the time) were treated to a delicious catered lunch. In an old Nigerian phrase, "rice and stew (was) very plenty" (RSVP). We acknowledge the contributions of Cornelians in Nigeria and elsewhere for their donations toward the feast. #### What You Need to Know

- COVID-19 vaccines are effective at helping protect against severe disease and death from variants of the virus that causes COVID-19 currently circulating, including the Delta variant.
- If you are fully vaccinated you can resume many activities that you did before the pandemic, but you should wear a mask indoors in public if you are in an area of substantial or high transmission to maximize protection from the Delta variant and possibly spreading it to others.
- You may have <u>side effects</u> after vaccination. These are normal and should go away in a few days.
- Learn how to find a COVID-19 vaccine so you can get it as soon as you can.

COVID-19 vaccines teach our immune systems how to recognize and fight the virus that causes COVID-19. It typically takes 2 weeks after vaccination for the body to build protection (immunity) against the virus that causes COVID-19. That means it is possible a person could still get COVID-19 before or just after vaccination and then get sick because the vaccine did not have enough time to build protection. People are considered fully vaccinated 2 weeks after their second dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccines, or 2 weeks after the single-dose Johnson & Johnson's Janssen COVID-19 vaccine.
